#### Expenses and targets

- Approximately \$3,000 p.p.
  - UQ managed: airfares, accommodation, collective transport/events, National Park visit, materials
  - Individually managed: meals & incidentals, airport transfers in Brisbane, individual transport in country, vaccinations, etc.
- 15 NCP grants for domestic students @ \$3,000
- Max. 5 self-funded (domestic and international) students:
